### COST

Refund requests must be submitted in writing by the second day of each session. No refund will be given to students dismissed due to disciplinary or attendance reasons.

### REGULATIONS

- All regulations in effect during the regular school year are also in effect during summer school, including behavioral expectations and dress code.
- Students taking core courses for original credit must take the next course in sequence during the following school year.
- Credits earned during summer school or online do not apply toward GPA.

### ATTENDANCE

Because of strict state guidelines, attendance and promptness are essential. Students cannot receive credit if the student is absent more than 6 hours per semester, which is equal to 1 day of attendance. Any time spent outside of class due to tardiness is accumulated as an absence.

Students may only register for one course (0.5 credit) per semester in regular summer school.

If a student takes one of the courses listed below during the regular school year and he or she fails the course, he or she may recover the credit by participating in the online Credit Recovery program. Courses are offered online in a computer lab setting with teacher support. Students move at their own pace using the computer to achieve credit. Each course must be completed within 12 lab sessions. The cost is the same as regular summer school and students may register for one course per time slot. The Credit Recovery program does not allow for modification of content, certain accommodations, or delivery of instruction. These factors should be carefully considered before enrollment if student requires curriculum modifications and/or instructional accommodations.

Students are encouraged to register early for classes as they will fill quickly.

Because of strict state guidelines, attendance and promptness are essential. **Students cannot receive credit if the student is absent more than 2 hours, 45 minutes, which is equal to one session in the day.** Any time spent outside of class due to tardiness is accumulated as an absence.
